2. SI MARIBOR0: The University of Maribor will send its decision within **3** weeks. UK LONDON029: UCL aims to send its decision within **4** weeks of receiving all application materials.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **5** weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. (UCL endeavours to meet this target, however it may not always be possible). See www.ucl.ac.uk/current-students/exams_and_awards/qualifications/transcripts. *[It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]*
4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]
